MDPAG Executive Board Member Responsibilities

President:

- Be responsible for the administration of the Guild.
- Set the agenda for all Board meetings and for all business to be brought up at Guild meetings.
- Preside over all Board and Guild meetings to be sure that the agenda is followed.
- Be personally familiar with the status of all committee work to assure that the committees adhere to the Guild's policies and purposes and that the programs are being carried forward effectively. Be a member ex-officio of all committees (except the Nominating Committee).
- Appoint a parliamentarian to aid in the running of meetings and related matters if desired; and
- Approve bills for payment.
- The President may authorize individual expenditures not already in the budget up to \$200.00 and may be a signer on any check along with one other executive Board member.

Vice President:

- Assist the President in the accomplishment of his/her duties.
- Assume the President's responsibilities in his/her absence.
- Book meeting locations, dates and times for Clay Days and all general meeting as determined by the Board.
- Inform the treasurer of payments needed for meeting room rentals and any other expenses.
- Be responsible for planning all of the programs held at Guild meetings.
- Post the annual meeting schedule to the Members-Only Internet news group and send the information to the Web Site Coordinator for the web site.
- The Vice President may be a signer on any check along with one other executive Board member.

Treasurer:

- Administer and keep accurate records of the Guild's finances.
- Deposit the Guild's funds in a bank designated by the Board.
- Pay bills on behalf of the Guild and have the power to approve bills for payment.
- Prepare monthly financial statements for presentation at Guild meetings and post those statements to the Board internet group immediately after the meeting each month.
- Prepare an annual financial report for presentation at the Annual meeting held in June of each year.
- Prepare the budget for presentation at the first Fall meeting each year.
- Prepare interim reports upon the direction of the Board.
- The Treasurer may be a signer on any check along with one other executive Board member.

Secretary:

- Keep copies of the Bylaws and keep them current.
- Record minutes from all Board and Guild meetings.
- Prepare a synopsis of Board activities, drawn from the Board minutes, for distribution to Guild membership through the Guild's newsletter or internet sites, if requested to do so by the Board.
- Assist the President in developing and distributing the agenda for Board Meetings and Guild meetings.
- Handle outgoing correspondence, thank-you notes, etc. on behalf of the Guild at the Board's direction.
- The Secretary may be a signer on any check along with one other executive Board member.

Librarian's Responsibilities: (This is not an Executive board position)

- Purchase and maintain items in all media on the subject of polymer clay and related subjects.
- Establish or maintain appropriate policies related to the access of such items by members.
- Contact members who have overdue or damaged library items. Report to the Membership Chairman the names of members who have failed to return library items after the allowed two-month check-out period, and the names of members who owe the Guild for replacement of lost or damaged items.
- Maintain an up-to-date listing of library items and a record of members who check items out. Inventory library items immediately before and after Retreat and before the September membership meeting.
- Provide the Website, Newsletter and Members-Only internet news group coordinators with a the current library procedures and a current listing of library materials; and update that listing as materials are added to or taken from the library.


