MDPAG 2020 Swap

We will swap DIY texture sheets for our 2020 swap. A simple Google search will show many unique ways to create a texture sheet. There will be a demo at the October 2019 guild meeting. Kathy Weinberg will be the Swapmeister and swap items will be due at the March 2020 meeting.

You can sign up for the swap at the October meeting. Please don't sign up if you can't commit to getting your items done on time.

Swap Information:

- Swap items are due at the March 21st meeting and will be returned at Retreat and at the May 16th meeting.
- Make 1 texture sheet for each person who signed up.
- Texture sheets need to be 3" x 3".
- Texture sheets can be any style be creative.
- Create one "master texture sheet" and cure it. Put a release agent on it (Armor-all, water, cornstarch, etc) and press it onto a 3" x 3" piece of scrap clay. Make as many as needed using this method.
- Sign your name on the back of each sheet.
- Give them to Swapmeister Kathy Weinberg in a large Ziploc bag and write your name on the bag.
